Greetings from Colebrook Town Hall.

The Colebrook Board of Education will honor Principal Beth Driscoll by hosting an informal drop-in on Wednesday, June 4th, from 5:30-7 p.m. in the school library. This will provide an opportunity for parents and community members to thank Beth for her successful 18 years of leading Colebrook Consolidated School and to wish her well in retirement. Light refreshments will be served. Everyone is invited.

Road oiling was completed this week on Prock Hill, McClave, Old Colebrook, Wolford Hill, and Fritz Roads. Sweeping will take place next week, and loose stone will be recycled and re-used in July.

Ten years ago, the non-profit Colebrook Preservation Society (CPS) began the work of restoring the exterior of the iconic Colebrook Store. Now, they are focused on making the interior space of Colebrook's 1792 landmark more sound, functional, and welcoming. When the work is completed, the CPS will have a new operator in place. The Colebrook Store's service, menu and product offerings will reflect the wishes of the community, as captured in a survey conducted last year.

Based on bids gathered, the Colebrook Preservation Society anticipates the cost of the restoration to be upwards of \$100,000. As the non-profit organization that owns the store building on behalf of the community, the Colebrook Preservation Society is seeking financial support to achieve its restoration goal. The restoration is slated to begin this month with completion targeted for the fall.

In July 2023, heavy rainfall and flooding did significant damage to area roads and bridges. Pisgah Mountain Road was impacted, incurring an estimated \$30,000 in damage. Since then, the historic and scenic one-mile stretch of dirt road has been closed to motor vehicles—available exclusively to hikers and dog walkers. As we approach the 2-year anniversary of its closing to vehicles, the Department of Public Works and Colebrook Conservation Commission have collaborated on a fiscally responsible maintenance plan.

On Tuesday, June 3rd, at 6 p.m. a public informational meeting will be held in the upstairs meeting room at Town Hall to discuss whether to continue prohibiting vehicle access on Pisgah Mountain Road. We'll be joined by a representative from the T2 Center, a UCONN-based organization that provides technical assistance to local municipalities for road and bridge maintenance. Several years ago, the T2 Center studied Pisgah Mountain Road, and one of their recommendations was to restrict vehicle access, and to maintain the road as a recreational trail.
