

Greetings from Colebrook Town Hall.

The Department of Public Works (DPW) reports that Riverton Road in Colebrook will be closed from the Barkhamsted/Colebrook line to Old Forge Road for tree work next Monday, January 12th, from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m.

During the winter months, DPW strives to keep our 40 miles of town roadways passable (with the state responsible for Route 8, 44, 182, 182A and 183 in Colebrook). We ask you to please refrain from blowing, plowing or shoveling snow into the street, especially after it has been plowed. These areas re-freeze and the snow blown into the road creates a hazard for those traveling on the roads. When driving, please extend courtesy to our plow drivers. Their hours are long and visibility can be challenging. The hazards have been escalated this year due to more frequent snow squalls.

Sand mix is available at the Town Garage (43 Sandy Brook Road) for Colebrook residents, by hand bucket. Limit 2 buckets, per household, per winter storm event. Please bring your own shovel.

Jeremy DeCarli, our new Zoning Enforcement Officer (subject to formal approval at the January 12th Planning & Zoning Commission meeting) has begun working for us. Jeremy’s office hours in the Town Hall Land Use office are from 12:30 to 4:30 p.m. on Tuesdays, the same day our Building Inspector, Bill Volovski, is in Town Hall and out on inspections. The kickoff meeting of our newly-formed “*Slow Down, Colebrook*” Committee was held at the end of December. The mission is to encourage safer driving on Colebrook roads through a positive, family-oriented community awareness campaign that will be rolled out this spring. The goal is to reduce speeding, protect pedestrians and cyclists, and promote a culture of courtesy and care in our town.

Next week will mark four months of food scrap recycling through our pilot program with USA Recycling. Scraps are transported weekly to an anaerobic digestion facility in Massachusetts where they are turned into renewable energy, a soil amendment, and animal bedding. To date, we’ve collected almost two tons of compostable scraps.

Bulk waste pickup is available every week for items that will not fit in your bin. Please call 860.379.1662 by Thursday of each week for Friday morning pickup. Electronic items and building materials are not accepted.

Electronic items may be left at the Town Garage, outside of the storage unit which sits to the right of the garage. Accepted items include:

- Computers/Monitors/Modems/Printers/Keyboards/Mice
- TVs/VCRs/DVD Players/Video Game Players
- Copiers/Scanners/Fax Machines
- iPods/Personal digital assistants
- Stereos
- Telephones/Cell phones
- Tablets/E-readers
- Microwaves
- Other small appliances

Items NOT accepted include:

- Smoke detectors
- Hazardous materials (lighter fluid/liquids/paint/oils)
