

Greetings from Colebrook Town Hall.

On Tuesday, July 14th, the town of Colebrook will hold a special town meeting at 8 p.m. in the second-floor meeting room at Colebrook Town Hall (562 Colebrook Road). As prescribed by ordinance, voters will consider a supplemental appropriation for fiscal year 2025/26, necessitated by unanticipated special education and health insurance costs.

The question to be considered is as follows: “*Shall the town approve a supplemental budget request for up to \$39,900 for the Board of Education for fiscal year 2025/26, as recommended by the Board of Finance?*” Any Colebrook property owner with \$1,000 in assessed value is eligible to vote at this special town meeting.

Taxes were due July 1st, and are considered late if not paid by Monday, August 3rd (with the Tax Collector’s office open 9 a.m.-1 p.m. that day) and will be subject to interest from the due date. During July, the Tax Collector’s office will be open Mondays, Wednesdays and Thursdays, from 9 am-noon. The Colebrook Town Pond is open for the season. Lifeguards will be on duty on Saturdays and Sundays from 10 a.m.-6 p.m. through the end of August. The gates will be open Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. with no lifeguard on duty.
